

## Meet Joyce and Kaylee!

No one chooses to be part of Widows in Touch! No one chooses to lose a mate! But on March 17, 2008, the Lord took Dan Rase home to be with Himself. Dan was husband to Joyce and “daddy” to McKayla (Kaylee) Nicole, born July 23, 2004. Dan also served as the Youth and Children’s Ministries’ pastor at Temple Baptist Church in Portsmouth, Ohio.

Joyce lost her husband, Dan, suddenly to heart failure, just four days after his forty-third birthday. Dan was born on March 13, 1965, and Joyce was born on Valentine’s Day that same year.

Before coming to Temple, Dan served as youth pastor at Calvary Baptist Church and also Twin Valley Baptist Church, where Joyce’s father, Don Noel, serves as pastor. It was there that Dan met Joyce and they fell in love. They were married at Twin Valley on October 1, 1994. Ten years later, the Lord allowed them to adopt little Kaylee.

Dan and Joyce came to Temple to work with the youth in 1999. They worked as a wonderful team and the youth program grew from 4 to 5 kids to over 50 regular attendees on Wednesday nights, including a youth group of 15 to 20 kids who

regularly attend SS, Sunday and Wednesday nights. As a couple in ministry, Temple Baptist testifies, “They were truly equally yoked.”



Dan had also served his community as Hospice and SOMC Chaplain, chairman of CRADLE Crisis Pregnancy Care Center, and co-founder of both the Koinonia Golf League and Baptist Youth Quiz League.

Dan was a 1983 Portsmouth High School graduate and a 1987 graduate of Cedarville College. Joyce shares her loss with her parents and Dan’s parents, along with brothers, sisters, nephews, nieces and many friends.

Joyce continues to work with the youth at Temple Baptist, counseling them as they deal with their grief and as she faces her own. As the Lord directs, Joyce plans to lead the Olympian Word of Life Club on Wednesday nights, while other volunteer leaders work with the teens and college age on Wednesday and Sunday nights. I am also thinking of those men on our list who have lost wives, the mothers of their children. May God meet each need and give you a blessed day!!

I am a very fortunate lady to have my mother—and my dad—live right next door to me. Just a few minutes ago, my mother walked over to visit with me for a few minutes. My mom



is 87 years young and is still able to keep active. Two years ago, the Lord preserved her life when her aorta began to tear, but doctors were able to operate and replace a portion of her aorta. This winter she has been attending a small Bible study that I teach at one of our neighbor’s homes. It is a blessing to share her fellowship. My dad is 86 and just finished eight weeks of radiation for prostate cancer. He seemed to go through the treatments quite well. We will get final results in a

month or so.

Both my mom and dad love the Lord. My mom accepted the Lord when she was a young girl about 12 years old. She prayed that the Lord would give her a husband who loved the Lord. Her pastor did not discourage her from marrying my dad who did not know the Lord, but Dad did accept the Lord shortly after their marriage. Under their new pastor’s faithful preaching, both of them grew quickly. I thank the Lord for my parents’ faithful church attendance, Sunday morning, evening and prayer meeting, so that I could grow under a steady diet of the Word of God.
